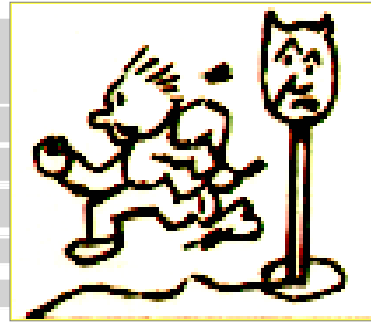

The Union Pacific built from the East, while the Central Pacific worked from the West. The Iron Road recounts the six years of harsh labor, searing heat, Indian attacks, and frontier lawlessness these railroad men endured to complete this visionary enterprise.
