Foxhunt Report

The Nov 2008 CFMC Foxhunt Results Nov 1st by Tom N9CBA

The November 2008 CFAR hunt had nice dry weather in the 50s. The Foxes, Tom N9CBA and Don K9VGJ, hid in spot that Don had scouted out. The area was between a retaining wall and the I-88 fence in Oakbrook, adjacent to Costco. The first antenna tried was very stealthy, but it did

not hit the repeater adequately. The antenna that was used was a 5/8 mag-mount sticking mostly horizontally to the top of a fence pole for that fence. The foxes located the antenna, and then followed the coax to the nearby hedge, that provided comfortable concealment.

The spot, being below the grade of the nearby parking lot, did not give the foxes a view of nearby hunters, but the teams did report checking out various spots north and south of I-88.

We munched at Giordano's in Oakbrook Terrace, just north of the hiding spot across 22nd street.
