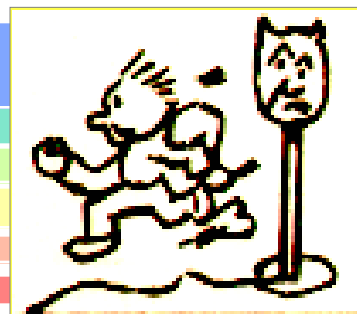

OIL SPILL. The Deepwater Horizon oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico concerns us all. In a YouTube presentation, CW Roberts contractors prove their offbeat solution for cleaning up the oil. The solution is ordinary hay. This method requires no toxic chemicals. Of course, the aerosol pollution from the oil would still be a problem.

The presentation demonstrates that two varieties of common field hay are magnets for oil. Each successive hay deployment removes more of the floating oil, further purifying the water. One hitch: The cleanup crew must somehow remove the oil-drenched hay. In their video, the contractors pick up the used hay with hand-nets. Whether the Coast Guard or British Petroleum could scale up such hand nets is an unknown. Dispersing a mat of hay over 1,150 or so square miles would be another challenge. Also, the hay wouldn't affect submerged oil.

I've just read that Walton County, Florida might go ahead with the hay solution. Detractors predict that hay might not attract weathered oil. Or that oily hay might just sink to the bottom of the Gulf, killing wildlife. Others insist that corncobs, human hair, or supertankers would do a better job. Meanwhile, the County believes that action trumps argument. The county has stockpiled hay in case the slick swings toward Florida. (See...

MEMORIAL DAY. I'm writing these minutes over Memorial Day Weekend. Stories of two Pearl Harbor veterans inspire me. Lieutenant John Finn, 100, died on May 27. On December 7, 1941, incoming Japanese planes awoke Lt. Finn. He secured a machine gun post and returned fire. Despite taking several hits, Finn remained at his post. Retired Lieutenant Commander Don Raleigh, 91, served aboard the USS Maryland. That fateful morning, the Maryland was in the harbor. Raleigh could see the bombs as they began raining down. At first, padlocks on the ammunition prevented the Maryland from returning fire. Raleigh sawed off the locks and helped to get the anti-aircraft guns going. Although two bombs hit the Maryland, it remained afloat.

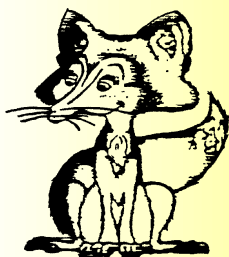

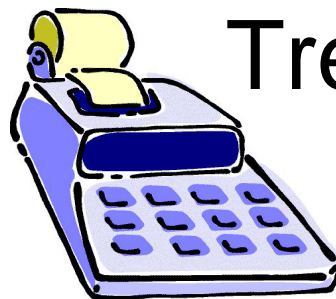
