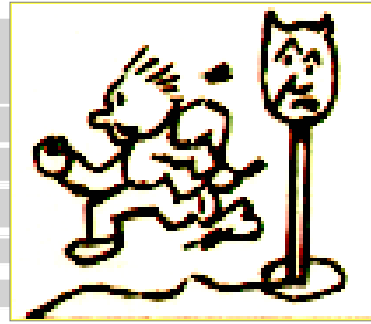

SRO has been a very fortunate club to have someone like Gil. He helped to develop and build SRO and keep it sustained during a time of contraction in ham radio. Gil held every office which includes being the only 3 time - non consecutive year President. He was President in 1964, 1968 and 1975. While not President, he usually served on the Board. Although George Ulm W9EVT built the first two 2M repeaters in Chicago in 1962, one for CFMC and SRO, Gil and Jon K9IQF developed CFAR as the first area-wide coverage machine. Through their efforts, they kept it on the air all these years. As a result, Gil was affectionately known as C-Father.

Gil got involved in a big way with computers around the time the TRS-80 was popular. He swapped files via modem before there was an internet as we know it today. Swapping 1Meg files with Harvey at 300 baud was really a big deal. Gil also was an early foxhunter who teamed up with Jim WA9FPT to find

ingenueous places to hide - one time floating in a rubber raft under an overpass - and then finding out the raft had a leak!

Gil has always been been a mover and a shaker - someone who got things done - look at all the wonderful kids he had - with Rose's help - of course. When the kid s were still living with them, Gil's shack was in the lowest level of the basement. Going down there was an experience - I would always forget how many levels there really were.

In closing, we will all really miss Gil. He was a really good guy who was not reluctant to help. He did a great deal for SRO, CFAR and ham radio. We will miss him. His kind does not come around very often. Thanks Gil.

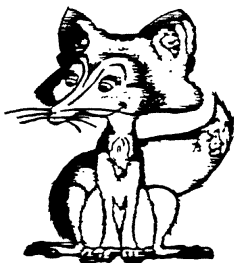

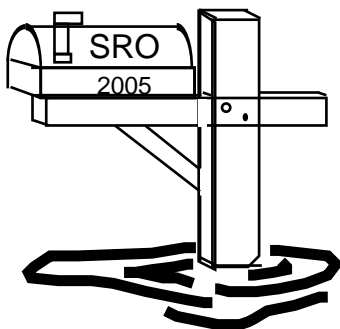
