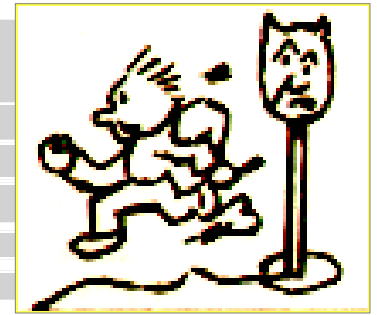

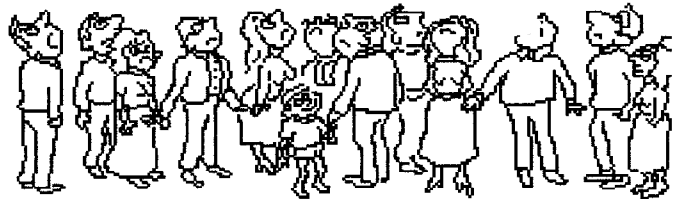

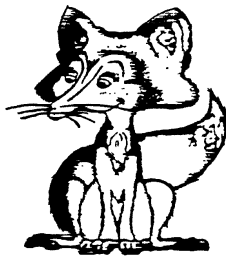

3. Greg N9SA

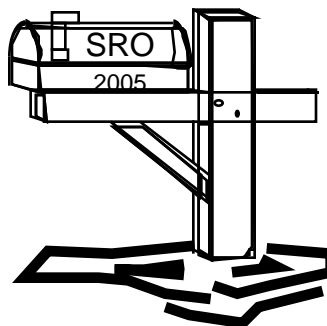
